On august 21, 1944, the Battle of the Falaise-Chambois pocket came to an end

And with it came the end of the Battle of Normandy after almost 80 days of fighting. Once Caen had been liberated, the town of Falaise became the new strategic objective as the Allies began to see the possibility of encircling the routed German army.

At the beginning of August 1944, Canadian and Polish troops, supported by the British, rushed towards Falaise (operations Totalize and Tractable), while American and French units enveloped the German forces from the south.

It was in a small area of just a few dozen km², at Montormel, that the last tragic act of the liberation of Normandy would be played out, involving troops from all the belligerent nations, as well as the civilian population trapped in the fighting.

LE MEMORIAL DE MONTORMEL



In the hell of the Falaise - Chambois pocket



Overlooking the Dives valley and offering an exceptional view of the battlefield, the Montormel Memorial retraces the entire battle of the Falaise-Chambois pocket (August 19-21, 1944), thanks to its modern museographic space and the explanations of a guide.

Berjou Liberation Museum



Thanks to many objects found on the battlefields and and explanations provided by a guide, the Museum of Liberation, Located on the heights of Berjou, near Condé sur Noireau, traces the battle that raged through the 15, 16 and 17 August 1944 around the Noireau. This was the penultimate bloody battle before the Falaise-Chambois pocket was closed, in which the British soldiers of the 43rd «Wessex» Infantry Division and the Sherwood Rangers Yeomanry distinguished themselves with valour.

MEMORIALS AND MONUMENTS

> POLISH AND CANADIAN MILITARY CEMETERIES



Located between Caen and Falaise, these two cemeteries are a reminder of the sacrifice of Canadian and Polish troops during the Battle of Normandy:

- Cintheaux Canadian Military Cemetery: 2,958 graves
- Urville-Langannerie Polish Military Cemetery: 696 graves

> GOODWOOD MEMORIAL Castine-en-Plaine



Created to mark the 80th anniversary of the Battle of Normandy, this monument pays tribute to the tank and infantry battles of Operations Goodwood, Totalize and Tractable in July and August 1944, which led to the liberation of Caen and opened the way to Falaise and the closure of the Falaise-Chambois pocket.



HISTORICAL ROUTES

> THE RESISTANCE TRAIL © ARGENTAN

On foot • 1 h • Free

On this 7-stop trail, discover around ten portraits of Argentan Resistance fighters out of the thirty or so names of resistance fighters that dot the town's streets. Scan the QR code and take part in the digital game, for a totally immersive experience of the troubled period of the Second World War





> FALAISE 1944 OPERATION RECONSTRUCTION ° FALAISE

On foot • 1 h • Free

Armed with your smartphone, explore the heritage of the Reconstruction and set off to discover Falaise thanks to the Legendr© application. Follow the trail, solve the riddles and take advantage of the augmented reality projections to discover the history of Falaise during and after the Second World War with your family.

A 10-stop signposted historical trail with illustrated explanatory panels, which take you to the strategic places of the last battle of Normandy and the famous Falaise-Chambois pocket.

Rising from the Ruins : Cities at the heart of war

Falaise Memorial Charge (included in ticket price)

From bombing to reconstruction, urban centres played a special role during the war, with invariably the same victims: the civilian population. With the help of archive documents and authentic objects from all over the world, this exceptional exhibition provides answers to some essential questions.

2/07 to 1/10

80 years = 80 objects

Flers - municipal hall Free admission

Presentation of military equipment, everyday objects and archives, some of which have never been seen before. Two remembrance rooms also pay tribute to the soldiers of the British 11th Armoured Division and the Resistance fighters of the Flers sector.

25/04 to 03/11

Thury-Harcourt Castle park Free admission

In front of the remains of the Château d'Harcourt, destroyed by German troops in August 1944, enjoy an open-air exhibition to discover the history of the Battle of Normandy in the Cingal-Suisse Normande area.

Great hike : civilian exodus 1944 28/07

In two stages between Falaise and Chambois, relive the exodus of many civilians in the footsteps of two Norman Cobs. Alternating bus and walking tours (2 x 8 km) through the exodus and death row sites, with musical entertainment, historical explanations and social events.
